LAKE CITY CLASSIC 2019

"Lake City Classic" presented by Spokane Figure Skating Club (SFSC) will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the current rulebook, as well as any pertinent updates which have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and is a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. Citizens.

A test session will be hosted by the SFSC on May 24, 2019. Test Applications will be processed online at www.entryeeze.com. The test application deadline is April 24, 2019 at 11:59 p.m. PST. In addition to online test session registration at Entryeeze, please submit a U.S. Figure Skating Permission form to SFSC test chair:

EVENT GUIDELINES:

Except as otherwise specified in this announcement, all events will be conducted in accordance with the US Figure Skating, Compete USA and National Showcase Guidelines, as published by US Figure Skating and posted under those categories on the US Figure Skating website.

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

Compete USA Levels: Each skater should enter events based on their skill level as of the closing date of entries.

Snowplow Sam through Basic 6 skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.

Pre-Free Skate through Free Skate 6 eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.

Well – Balance and Excel Test levels: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline in the discipline the skater is entering. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they qualify, but they may not skate down in any event and not at multiple levels in the same event during the same competition. Skaters who placed in the top four in a final round of their last qualifying competition in their divisions must move up one level, except for novice and higher.

Excel: Competition level will be determined by the highest Free Skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or "skate up" to one level higher. IJS Excel Free Skate events **are not** eligible for IJS protocol for test credit; program components are not compatible. Skaters may not enter both a Well-Balanced Free Skate event and an Excel Free Skate event at the same non-qualifying competition.

Canadian individual skaters do not need to change their programs if they wish to register for this competition. All Canadian skaters will be allowed to skate their official programs. In events where the Canadian program may be longer with additional elements, extra elements not included in the U.S. Figure Skating rules will not be judged.

Age restrictions/requirements: Singles free skate events (Well Balanced Program) Girls - 12 years of age or younger; Boys - 13 years of age or younger Open Juvenile: Girls - 13 years of age or older; Boys - 14 years of age or older Intermediate must be under the age of 18 Adults must be 21 years of age or older Skaters entering beginner–pre-juvenile events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group.

ENTRIES: Entries must be received online through the "Lake City Classic" page at www.entryeeze.com by April 24, 2019, at 11:59 p.m. PST. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee and SFSC and will be subject to a \$30.00 late entry fee. No entries will be accepted after the schedule has been completed.

FEES:

- No-Test through Adult Masters solo events will be \$85.00 for the first event and \$35.00 for each subsequent event.
- Compete USA solo events will be \$35.00 for the first event and \$25.00 for each subsequent event.
- Team Events will be \$10.00 per skater
- All Showcase Duets will be \$40.00 per duet.
- Showcase Mini Productions (3-7 skaters) \$10.00 per skater
- Production Ensembles will be \$100.00 per group.

REFUND POLICY: Entry fees will not be refunded after the close of the entries on April 24, 2019, unless no competition exists, or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$35.00 fee. Payment of the fee will be requested before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events. Notification of competition and practice ice times will be available on www.entryeeze.com.

FACILITIES: The competition will be held at [Frontier Ice Area](#), 3525 W. Seltice Way, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho 83814. Free outdoor parking is located just outside the entrance to the rink. The ice surface is an indoor rink measuring 200 x 85 with rounded corners. Locker rooms and concession facilities are available. There is rink side seating with heating overhead as well as seating inside the rink lobby, with large panes of glass that look toward the ice surface. There are restaurants available nearby at Riverstone Park, located on W. Riverstone Dr., bordered by Seltice Way and Northwest Blvd. South of Hwy 90.

MUSIC – MP3 FORMAT ONLY: Music will be supplied to this competition through www.entryeeze.com upload system only. The official competition music must be submitted through www.entryeeze.com by May 10, 2019. **A CD (no CD-RWs) should be readily available at rink side during the competition.** Every reasonable care will be taken, but the Spokane Figure Skating Club cannot be responsible for CDs left at the end of the competition. Do to time commitment necessary to organize music a \$25 late fee will be assessed for every piece of music submitted after May 10, 2019.

It is **strongly recommended** that coaches take responsibility for uploading the music to make sure the music meets the following criteria. A global account in Entryeeze allows the coach to upload the skater's music and lock the file once it is uploaded.

- (1) Correct format- even though Entryeeze allows the upload of mp4 our system plays mp3
- (2) The music is rendered with only a few seconds of blank time on either end of the piece of music. Saves space and makes movement between selections easier.
- (3) The correct music is loaded for the correct event.

To ensure your skater gets the correct music and avoid delays during the competition, please include the name of the skater in the title of the music along with the event type. Example: firstname_lastname_showcaselight. There are frequent duplicate music selections so putting song name in the file name is not helpful to the person organizing the music

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, Spokane Figure Skating Club, Lake City Figure Skating, and Frontier Ice Arena accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

JUDGING SYSTEM: The International Judging System (IJS) will be used for Short Program Events as well as Well-Balanced Programs from No Test to Senior, Pairs Pre-Juvenile-Senior, and Adult Gold and Masters Novice –Senior and Excel Pre Preliminary-Senior Free Skate events. All competitors skating in the IJS events need to submit the Planned Program Content (PPC) form with their entry via www.entryeeze.com. Competitors not submitting required PPC forms via www.entryeeze.com will be required to provide a paper copy of their PPC prior to registering and pay a \$25 late fee.

All other events will be judged using the 6.0 judging system.

SEPARATION INTO GROUPS: Certain groups may be combined male/female, and/or by age, and/or by level at the discretion of the referee. Compete USA levels will have no more than 6 participants in a group and each group will be considered a final round for the purpose of results and awards. There will be no qualifying of skaters for a championship round by event.

REGISTRATION: The official registration desk will be located at the front desk of [Frontier Ice Arena](#) and will be open one hour before the first competitive event and run through the last event of the last day. All skaters are required to register 60 minutes before their scheduled event. In addition to submitting music into Entryeeze, it is recommend to submit music CD's at time of registration.

PRACTICE ICE FOR SOLO EVENTS: Reservations for practice ice must be made and paid for at the time of entry. Practice sessions will be held for each day of the competition. Practice ice will be \$15.00 per 20-minute session. Requests for practice ice will be handled through the online entry process and is a part of your entry form. You may sign up for one practice session per event entered.

SFSC cannot offer specific times for practice ice until the number of competitors and events are known. Once the competition schedule is finalized by the Chief Referee, specific practice ice times will be made available to complement the competition schedule. At such time, skaters will be able to log into their account in www.entryeeze.com and select practice ice times.

After the close of registration and the initial practice ice reservation period, additional practice ice sessions may become available. This will be announced through www.entryeeze.com. Please make sure the email address submitted during online entry is accurate to receive updates about practice ice availability and scheduling.

Practice ice for solo events may also be sold at the registration desk during the competition on a first-come, first-serve basis for \$20.00 per each 20-minute session, including drop-ins. There will be no refunds for those who do not appear for their reserved practice session. Every effort will be made to schedule practice ice on the same day as the event, but this is not guaranteed.

PRACTICE ICE FOR MINI-PRODUCTION & PRODUCTION ENSEMBLES: Practice ice for mini-production and production practice ice will be added once the schedule is posted, if time permits.

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY: A photographer will be providing photos for purchase. Due to agreements with our photographer, photos and videotaping is limited to your own skater. **Additionally, for the safety of the skaters, flash photography is not permitted in the arena at any time.**

AWARDS: Each group will receive awards immediately following the posting of results for the event. Medals will be given to the top three places of each event. ALL compete USA competitors will receive an award.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained at Frontier Ice Arena. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information. Skaters are requested to arrive **60 minutes prior** to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition. The official schedule showing starting times for each event and the draw will be posted on the bulletin board. The official schedule supersedes all other schedules. Notices posted on this bulletin board are considered as sufficient notice to all competitors.

COSTUMES: U.S. Figure Skating rule 6030-6034 Clothing and Equipment-Singles. The clothing of the competitors must be modest, dignified and appropriate for athletic competition, not garish or theatrical in design. Clothing may, however, reflect the character of the music chosen. A. The skating clothing worn in actual competition may not bear any form of advertising. However, warm-up suits may bear the name of a sponsor when a skater is on the ice. The sponsor's name must not exceed 4.65 square inches (30 square centimeters). 6032 Clothing must not give the effect of excessive nudity inappropriate for the discipline. Accessories and props are not permitted. 6033 Men must wear full-length trousers. Ladies may wear skirts, trousers and tights (including unitards). 6034 Any ornamentation attached to the clothing must be firmly fastened so as not to fall off while skating under normal competitive condition.

NO FEATHERS OF ANY KIND ARE PERMITTED ON THE ICE AS PART OF COSTUMES OR PROPS.

INFORMATION REGARDING COACHES: U.S. Figure Skating Rule MR 5.11 Coach and Instructor Compliance
[2018-19 U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook](#) (see page 81)

In order to be granted access to work within U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned activities, each coach must complete the following requirements on an annual basis by July 1:

1. Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating - either through a member club or as an individual member;
2. Must complete the coach registration process through the U.S. Figure Skating Members Only site, submit proper payment for the annual registration fee of \$30 and, if 18 years of age or older, successfully pass the background screen.
3. Must complete the appropriate CER courses (A, B, C or D) depending on the highest level of students being coached as of July 1. See rule MR 5.12.
4. Must submit proof of current general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/\$5 million aggregate.

For Compete USA ONLY coaches - Any person, 18 and older, instructing in a Learn to Skate USA Program must have successfully passed the annual background screen and be registered as Learn to Skate USA instructor member.

For all Coaches - The local organizing committee/club will have a list of compliant coaches who are cleared for a credential at the competition. Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential – no exceptions. We strongly urge *all* coaches to have their cards with them. Non-credentialed coaches will not be permitted in the designated coaching area at rink side during events including practice sessions. Coaching at U.S. Figure Skating events without compliance is an ethics violation and is reported to U.S. Figure Skating and PSA.

BASIC ELEMENTS/ COMPULSORY EVENT: SNOWPLOW SAM – FREE SKATE 6

Format choice of the host: Each skater will perform each element when directed by a judge or referee or have the option to perform one element at a time in the order listed below (no excessive connecting steps). Referee driven format examples: all skaters perform first element before moving on to the next and so on, or each skater performs all of the required elements before moving on to the next skater.

- To be skated on 1/2 ice
- No music
- All elements must be skated in the order listed

SNOWPLOW SAM – BASIC 6 PROGRAM WITH MUSIC

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc., unless otherwise specified.

- To be skated on full ice with music.
- The skater may use elements from a previous level.
- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level. Bonus skills from the same level or below are allowed but will not be judged elements.
- Divide Snowplow Sam skaters by level (1-4), if registrations warrant
- Time 1:10 max.

PRE-FREE SKATE – FREE SKATE 1-6 PROGRAM WITH MUSIC

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times an element is executed, length of glides, number of revolutions, etc., unless otherwise stated. Connecting steps and transitions should be demonstrated throughout the program.

- To be skated on full ice.
- The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use but is not required to use any additional elements from previous levels.
- **Bonus skills from the same level or below are allowed but will not be judged elements.**
- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level.
- Time 1:40 max.

FREE SKATE & SHORT PROGRAM

Athletes and coaches are responsible for going to the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook for rules, program length, etc. All current and appropriate rules will be used. Coaches and athletes are expected to be aware of these rules by reading the documents at www.usfigureskating.org.

SINGLES FREE SKATING EVENTS

General event parameters:

- Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted.
- Level will be determined by the highest free skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed or skate up to one level higher.

EXCEL FREE SKATE (new for 2018-19 season)

General event parameters:

- Skaters may not enter both a Well-Balanced Free Skate event and an Excel Free Skate event at the same non-qualifying competition.
- Skaters will skate to the music of their choice. Vocal music is permitted at all levels.
- Level will be determined by the highest Free Skate test passed. Skaters may compete at the highest level they have passed, or “skate up” to one level higher.

NOTE- Program lengths for intermediate and Novice Programs will change February 1, 2019 to align with the Well-Balanced Program lengths changes

ADULT COMPULSORY MOVES

General event parameters:

- Elements may be skated in any order. Connecting steps are allowed but will not be taken into consideration in scoring. Spins may not be repeated. Only required elements may be included.
- All events are skated on ½ ice.
- Minimum number of revolutions are noted in parentheses.

COMPULSORY TEAM MOVES EVENT:**BASIC ELEMENTS/ COMPULSORY EVENT: SNOWPLOW SAM – FREE SKATE 6**

Format: The designated skater from each team will perform their chosen element in sequence on full ice, with no music.

- Minimum of three skaters on a team; each skater will do at least one required element.
- When the event is called, all skaters will take the ice for a two (2) minute STROKING ONLY warm-up.
- This will be followed by a one (1) minute individual warm-up for the elements.
- Teams will be directed to find a “base” for their team along the boards on the ice where they will stay for the remainder of the event.
- The announcer, referee or judge-in-charge will call the first element (e.g. jump or stop) to be performed.
- The team member performing the element will step forward and execute the skill, with the element first being performed by the skater on team one, then team two, then team three and so on.

Basic Elements/Compulsory Event: Snowplow Sam - Free Skate 6 Format

Once all the teams have had their skaters complete the element, the next element will be called.

- Judging is done with one mark for each element (skater) for total team points.
- Repeat #4-7 above as this will be done in sequence until all the elements at each level are completed.

TEAM COMPULSORY EVENT: (No Test – Senior and Multi-level)

No Test through Senior and Multi-level Single level teams must compete at the highest free skate test level of the skaters. Teams consist of 4 skaters, male or female and can be from different clubs. Skaters may participate on multiple teams. All teams for each level will be on the ice together. One member of each team will be required to do one of the four elements (all elements must be completed). Choose one element for each skater. Elements will be judged against the other teams' elements. Adults may join or form teams at their equivalent level. Each skater will be awarded one mark for technique.

The team will perform as a group and perform unifying steps prior to spotlighting each member performing an element. Group performance shall not exceed 2 minutes.

Multi Test Level - Skaters must represent more than one tested level

1. One waltz jump
2. One camel spin
3. One forward outside spiral
4. One Axel

No Test

1. One upright one foot spin (minimum 3 revolutions)
2. One waltz jump
3. One forward outside spiral; 1 position
4. Half flip landed on either foot

Pre-Preliminary/Adult Pre-Bronze

1. One upright one foot spin (minimum 4 revolutions)
2. One single Salchow.
3. One single toe loop
4. Half Lutz landed on either foot

Preliminary/Adult Bronze

1. One upright one foot spin minimum 4 revolutions.
2. One single Salchow.
3. One single flip jump.
4. Forward sit spin minimum 4 revolutions.

Pre-Juvenile/Adult Silver

1. One camel spin (minimum 4 revolutions)
2. One single loop jump
3. One camel spin to sit spin (no change of foot; minimum 3 revolutions, each position)
4. Combination jump - single Lutz, single loop (no change of foot between jumps)

Juvenile/Adult Gold

1. One layback spin (minimum 4 revolutions)
2. One single Axel jump
3. One forward spiral; one position
4. Combination jump - single Lutz, single loop (no change of foot between jumps)

Intermediate

1. Sit spin to change foot sit spin (minimum 4 revolutions each position)
2. Flying camel spin (minimum 5 revolutions in position)
3. One single Axel jump
4. Combination jump - double Salchow, single loop (no change of foot between) 13 of 28

Novice

1. Camel spin to backward camel spin (minimum 4 revolutions in each position)
2. Double loop jump
3. Forward spiral in one position to backward spiral one position (change of foot acceptable between spirals)
4. Combination jump - double Salchow, double toe (no change of foot between)

Junior

1. Camel spin to layback spin to back sit spin (minimum 4 revolutions in each position)
2. Double flip jump
3. Flying sit spin (minimum 6 revolutions in position)
4. Combination jump - double toe, double toe (no change of foot between)

Senior

1. Layback spin (minimum 8 revolutions in position)
2. Triple Salchow jump
3. Forward spiral to backward spiral to forward spiral in a serpentine pattern
4. Combination jump - double Lutz, double toe (no change of foot between)

DANCE EVENTS:

SOLO DANCE (Preliminary – Gold)

The 2019 Lake City Classic is NOT part of the National Solo Dance Competition Series.

General event parameters for solo pattern dance:

- Levels are based upon the skaters' highest pattern dance test passed.
- A solo pattern dance competition event will consist of the skater performing two solo pattern dances.
- The patterns to be skated depend upon which quarter of the year the competition is held.
- The skater will perform the two pattern dances listed for their level, based upon the date of the competition. If the competition falls over two quarters (for example, June 30th – July 2nd), the dance will be selected based on the start date of the competition listed in the announcement (in this example, the 2nd quarter).
- Skaters will complete both of the dances at each level. Dances will be scheduled at the discretion of the Chief Referee for each competition and may be competed consecutively or with a break in between pattern dances groupings.

PAIRS

PAIRS FREE SKATE (Pre-Juvenile - Senior)

General event parameters: Pairs Free Skating Program Open to all qualified skaters. At least one partner must have passed the appropriate pairs test. Partners must be male/female. Skaters are required to comply with the “well balanced program” requirements outlined in the current USFS Rule Book in Sections 7000 through 7923. (Also see USFS website).

- Juvenile**: At least the USFS Pre-Juvenile Pairs Test (Time: 2:30 +/- 10 sec)

- Novice**: At least the USFS Intermediate Pairs Test (Time: 3:30 +/- 10 sec)
- Junior**: At least the USFS Novice Pairs Test (Time: 3:30 +/- 10 sec)
- Senior**: At least the USFS Junior Pairs Test (Time: 4:00 +/- 10 sec)

- Each jump may be attempted twice; the best attempt will be counted.
- Pre-juvenile and lower will be skated ½ ice; Juvenile – senior will be skated on full ice

ADULT SINGLES FREE SKATE

General event parameters:

ADULT JUMPS CHALLENGE

General event parameters:

- Each jump may be attempted twice; the best attempt will be counted.
- Adult silver and lower will be skated ½ ice; adult gold – masters junior/senior will be skated on full ice
- Jumps with an “**” must be preceded with connecting steps (intermediate – senior)

ADULT SPINS CHALLENGE

General event parameters:

- Spins may be skated in any order. Connecting steps are allowed but will not be taken into consideration in scoring. Spins may not be repeated. Only required elements may be included.

SHOWCASE EVENTS

COMPETE USA / ADULT SHOWCASE & WELL-BALANCED

Showcase Events Elements: [click here for requirements](#)

Except as otherwise specified in this announcement, showcase events will be conducted in accordance with the Compete USA and Non-Qualifying Showcase Competition Guidelines, as published by US Figure Skating and posted under the National Showcase Program category on the US Figure Skating website. These events will be offered in Dramatic, Light Entertainment, Interpretive, Duets, Mini Production and Production Ensemble groups.

All Showcase Events will be skated with backstage curtain. Skaters will perform toward the judges opposite side of the audience.

COMPETE USA/ADULT SHOWCASE: Skaters may enter any or all singles events for which they are qualified by test level. Skaters cannot skate in different levels of the same event (example: event-Light Entertainment Level Junior skater would not be allowed to skate Light Entertainment Junior and Senior). Current guidelines and procedures for non-qualifying showcase competitions can be found [here](#).

Dramatic Entertainment: Programs should express intense emotional connection and investment in the music, choreography and theme concept through related skating movements, gestures and physical actions. Props and Scenery ARE permitted.

Light Entertainment: Programs should express a carefree concept or storyline designed to uplift and entertain the audience through related skating movements, gestures and physical actions.
Props and Scenery ARE permitted.

Interpretive (No-test-Senior): The program will be a performance choreographed by the competitor, unaccompanied and unassisted, to music that is supplied by the LOC. Programs should incorporate various elements of expressive movement and skating moves, to enhance the skater's interpretation of the music, rather than technical elements. The music will be played continuously during a 30-minute off ice session in a room. The room will be attended only by the adult monitor assigned to play the music, and the competing skaters. The music will be played twice during a warm-up on full ice. **After the warm up skaters will go back to the room, with no music being played.** Skaters will be brought to the ice when the previous skater finishes. All competitors in an event will interpret the same music. Props are permitted but must be brought into the room prior to listening to the music, and be taken to the ice only when the skater is called to perform. Props may not be pre-positioned on the performance surface.

Duets: Theatrical performances by any two competitors. Props and Scenery ARE permitted. Skaters may enter only one duet, one mini production ensemble and one production ensemble each.

Mini production ensembles: are theatrical performances by three to seven competitors. Props and Scenery ARE permitted. Programs are performed under full arena lighting. Skaters may enter only one duet, one mini production ensemble and one production ensemble each.

Production ensembles: Theatrical performances by eight or more competitors. NOTE: Skaters may enter only one duet, one mini production ensemble and one production ensemble each. Props and Scenery ARE permitted. Programs are performed under full arena lighting.
